Through this mega-maritime show, we strive to elevate Singapore's status as an international maritime centre by showcasing the republic's growing status as a shipping business and knowledge hub. *Sea Asia* is more than just a conference and exhibition. It is a platform for business networking and discussions and at the same time, a place for new innovations and the latest equipment and services to be exhibited.
